Reading

Name in a muddle

Can you write all the letters that make up your name? Put each letter on a separate piece of paper. Now turn them over and muddle them up. Turning them back over, can you put the letters back in the correct order? Once you are able to do this quickly, why not try and time yourself and see how long it takes you. You could also try muddling up and then putting together the letters in the name of someone in your family.



Physical development

Ready, steady, GO!

This activity is all about listening to and following an instruction. One person is the 'starter' and the other is the runner. Find a space where you can run safely. The starter gives a signal, ready for the runner to 'get ready and then go.' Can the starter count you down, pausing in-between counting, to ensure you are listening before you need to 'go!'



Emotional development

Masks

Lots of adults and older children are wearing face masks. Ask you grown up to help you look at some different people wearing face masks and other types of masks. What other masks might you see? (Spiderman and batman are a good example). Discuss how masks make people look different and what a mask does to covers up parts of the face.



Play the game: 'Are you smiling?'

Face a partner. Pretend you are wearing a mask by putting one hand sideways out in front of your face. Make either a sad or happy face- can your grownup work out if you are smiling or not? Note how you can still show emotions just with your eyes.

Kim's game

Which one is missing?

Playing 'Kim's game' is a good way of developing your memory skills and concentration – both skills useful for all learning.

Put 5 things from around the house on a tray - it could be things like a pencil, an orange, a toy etc. Look carefully at the objects for about thirty seconds. Then take the tray away and call out what you remember. Another way of playing the game is to cover the things over and then ask a grown up to take one thing away and try to spot what is missing. You can put more things on the tray as you get better at it.


